



2019 MN WIFT Production Grant Guidelines

Minnesota Women in Film and Television (MN WIFT) is pleased to announce the 2019 MN WIFT Finishing Grant. We will award \$1,500 in grant funds in 2019.

The grant will be awarded to one or more MN WIFT full member(s) working in film, television, or new media. The grant is intended for projects in the post production phase. Projects must be directed by women. Jurors will look for uniqueness of vision, artistic excellence, and professional quality.

The project(s) we choose to fund will be selected by a jury process (jurors are the MNWIFT Board of directors.) The \$1,500 in grant funds may be awarded to one applicant or split across up to 3 applicants.

Application Deadline: Submissions must be postmarked/emailed by Saturday June 15, 2019. The grant recipient(s) will be announced in July of 2019.

Minnesota Women in Film & Television (MN WIFT) is a 501(C)(3) non-profit, all-volunteer organization that educates, empowers, and engages women working in the film, television, and media industry. The Minnesota chapter of WIFT was formally established in 2005. It joins over 40 other Women in Film chapters with 10,000 global members.

Applying for the Grant - General Instructions

Please read the guidelines from beginning to end before starting the application. Allow a reasonable amount of time to complete and assemble the application materials. Submit only the materials that are required. Do not submit additional materials. Submission materials will not be returned.



Eligibility

Minnesota Women in Film and Television welcomes all full members who fulfill the following criteria to apply for the MN WIFT Finishing Grant. Only the applications that meet the eligibility requirements will be accepted for further consideration and judging.

Projects must be directed by women. The grant is open to individuals credited in director position.

Applicant must be:

- A U.S. citizen or have permanent resident alien status.
- A current Minnesota resident who has resided in the state continuously for a minimum of one full year before the application deadline. Applicants may be required to provide documentation in addition to a driver's license if residency is in question.
- A full member - current on MN WIFT dues.

2019 MN WIFT Finishing Grant jury members are not eligible to apply. Members of the MN WIFT Board of Directors are not eligible to apply.

Equal opportunity to participate in and benefit from the programs of MN WIFT is provided to all individuals regardless of race, national origin, color, age, religion, sexual orientation, or disability.

Application Materials

You must submit your work sample and the following written materials. Each of these materials must be included in the application by the deadline, or the applicant will be disqualified from consideration for the grant. Submission materials will not be returned.

Submit the Following Documents *(please include your name on each document)*

- [Application Cover Sheet](#) – please use document provided.
- Resumé may be up to two pages. Please highlight your work in the film, television, or new media industry.
- Grant Plan may be up to two pages telling us about your project. Your plan should include:
- Proposal narrative: a synopsis of your proposed project (what it is about, your vision, and why it is different or interesting.)
- Details:
 - Expected length of project;
 - Genre of your project;
 - Project timeline;
 - Key crew;
- Financial
 - Amount you are seeking from us;
 - How this will help you complete your project;
 - Project budget;
 - Possible additional funders;
- Work sample or samples are requested to give us an idea of your past work. We will view only 10 minutes from each applicant. Your work sample may be from one past project or excerpts from multiple past projects. If you are requesting finishing funds at least a portion of the 10 minutes of your work sample should include related footage.
 - Your work sample may be submitted via an internet link address (Vimeo, YouTube, etc.).
- Work sample list format is included with the application cover sheet - it asks you to list the title of the work, your role on the project, the running time of the full work, the running time of this sample and the year of completion.
- A copy of your MN Driver's License or MN- Issued Picture ID to verify proof of residency. You must be a Minnesota Resident (for at least one year) to qualify.

If you are selected to receive a grant

Each artist receiving a grant will be required to sign a contract stipulating the terms of the grant award. Grantees must return signed contracts within 45 days of the date on the official letter of notification. Grantees must submit a final report at the conclusion of grant activities. The grantee is encouraged to keep MN WIFT updated as to their project's status. Any changes to the grant plan must be approved by the MN WIFT Board. Grantees have one year from the contract date in which to complete grant activities. Grant will be distributed within 14 days of receiving the signed contract.
